21 **STANDING**

22 The petitioners are beneficiaries under the 2007 settlement
23 agreement signed by Dr. Jürgen-Peter Graf and two of the three
24 plaintiffs on a UK high court order signed by Lord Alan F.
25 Rodger in May 2011. The dual account numbers representing the
26 plaintiffs on the 2011 UK court order also substantiate our
27 standing in the 2007 settlement agreement. Therefore, we have
standing, and the need to make our petition to this court.

NATURE OF ACTION

As a result of a 2007 decision by the German Federal Criminal Court 1 signed by Dr. Jürgen-Peter Graf, and the 2011 UK high court order signed by Lord Alan F. Rodger, The Federal Republic of Germany, State of Hessen, Frankfurt-am-Main Court of Appeals was charged with, and voluntarily accepted, global jurisdiction and the judicial duty to protect the rights of the beneficiaries and ensure all court decisions be enforced. This acceptance can be substantiated by the computer monitor installed in the office of the president of the Frankfurt-am-Main Court of Appeals per the 2011 UK court order.

NONCONFORMANCE

Petitioners acknowledge the nonconformance of their motions with normal court protocols. However, we ask that the international nature of the matter and its beneficiaries may allow for some latitude. Also, the acceptance of previous actions have already set a precedence in this case. Such acceptances include, but are not limited, to:

- A. The 2011 UK High Court order submitted in English and Latin.
- B. Current oversight of the escrow accounts in an Austrian Bank.
- C. The lack of German legal credentials for the current administrator's legal counsel.
- D. Payment of over US\$20T in international wire transfers from British banks with all remittance in English.

1
2 **PETITIONER REQUEST**

3 Since no action has been taken on our "Petition to Enforce
4 Existing Court Orders and Decisions" filed January 23, 2018 by
5 either the current administrator or the current judicial
6 overseer, Petitioners request additional oversight be appointed.
7 The Petitioners will accept Crystal L. Schultz to represent the
8 interests of the Petitioners and Dr. Horst Köhler to represent
9 the interests of the Federal Republic of Germany.

10 Petitioners also request all German court case numbers and
11 any other identifying designators that represent any matters
12 related to the original 2007 settlement agreement and the 2011
13 UK High Court order in any jurisdiction be given to Petitioners.
14 Numerous extensive searches of both LexisNexis and German court
15 records have been unable to find any mention of the
16 aforementioned matters. It is time all beneficiaries have access
17 to the details and whereabouts of their funds and the knowledge
18 of all parties responsible for its management be made public per
19 German transparency rules and international laws of trustee.

20 Petitioners also request the current whereabouts and
21 contact information for the current administrator, Mr. Simon J.
22 Church aka unknown, be disclosed to Petitioners. Also the courts
23 assistance in arranging a direct meeting between Ms. Schultz and
24 Mr. Church for the purpose of restarting the beneficiaries'
25 payment process.

26 If needed, this petition will also serve as evidence in
27 filing an action in the International Criminal Court on charges

1 of "Interference with the Administration of Justice" and "Human
2 Rights" violations.

3 I swear, under penalty of perjury, that the information
4 contained in this petition is accurate and correct to the best
5 of my knowledge.
